



## Berlin as an open-air gallery\*

Discover street art in Berlin. The best 16 starting points for street art tours on your own.



### Skatepark at Gleisdreieck

🚌 2, 25, 26 Yorckstraße  
 🚇 1, 2, 3 Gleisdreieck  
 🚇 7 Yorckstraße

Experience urban art in action: sprayers, skaters and basketball players meet at the Legacy Wall in Gleisdreieckpark.



### Bülowstraße / Urban Nation

🚇 2, 3 Bülowstraße  
 🚇 1, 2, 3, 4 Nollendorferplatz

There is plenty of street art to discover on a walk along Bülowstraße and around the Urban Nation Museum for Contemporary Art.



### Oberbaumbrücke

🚌 3, 5, 7 Warschauer Straße  
 🚇 1, 3 Schlesisches Tor  
 🚇 1, 3 Warschauer Straße

As a symbol of the once divided city, the Oberbaumbrücke now connects Kreuzberg and Friedrichshain, two Berlin neighbourhoods with the highest density of street art.



### Mauerpark

🚇 2, M10 Eberswalder Straße

Known for its large Sunday flea market, lots of street music and its own graffiti zone (on top of the hill, at the Hinterlandmauer), this park along the former border strip is a lively meeting place.



### Moritzplatz

🚇 1, 3 Prinzenstraße  
 🚇 8 Moritzplatz  
 🚇 1, 3, 8 Kottbuser Tor

With the Aufbauhaus, also known as Berlin's creative department store, Moritzplatz is a meeting place for the creative scene - street art included.



### Bernauer Strasse memorial

🚇 8 Bernauer Straße

Here the world-famous photo of border policeman Conrad Schumann jumping over the barbed-wire fence was taken. While the memorial gives a moving impression of the history of the divided city, the murals all around are an expression of young Berlin.



### Mehringplatz

🚇 1, 3, 6 Hallesches Tor

The square, laid out as a roundabout around the Peace Column, is the centre of a culturally diverse district with many murals and museums within walking distance.



### Haus Schwarzenberg

🚌 3, 5, 7 Hackescher Markt  
 🚇 8 Weinmeisterstraße

The backyard of Haus Schwarzenberg is covered in murals, testifying to the diverse mix of this association-run open space for culture and creativity.



### Görlitz railway station

🚇 1, 3 Görlitzer Bahnhof

In the centre of the former post office district SO36, known as a stronghold of Berlin's alternative and squatter scene, you will find many murals - and good coffee in Markthalle Neun.



### Wedding

🚌 41, 42 Wedding  
 🚇 6 Wedding

On a walk through Wedding, there is also plenty of street art to discover between cultural neighbourhoods such as silent green, Fabrik 23 and the Wiesenburg.



### Boxhagener Platz

🚇 5 Samariter Straße

At the weekend, flea and street food markets attract visitors to Boxhagener Platz, which is surrounded by many small shops, cafés and murals.



### Marzahn

🚌 7 Poelchaustraße

The grey facades of former GDR prefabricated buildings have served as a canvas for large-scale murals since the Mural Festival 2019.



### Holzmarkt

🚌 3, 5, 7 Jannowitzbrücke  
 🚌 3, 5, 7, 9, 45 and various trains to Ostbahnhof  
 🚇 8 Jannowitzbrücke

As a cooperatively organised urban quarter, Holzmarkt offers plenty of space for creativity. In addition to colourful murals, there is culture, gastronomy - and cozy seating areas with a view of the Spree.



### Teufelsberg

🚌 3, 5, 7 Grunewald plus 30 minutes on foot

On the site of the former US listening station, you will find one of the largest street art galleries in the world - and enjoy a great view over Berlin from Teufelsberg.



### East Side Gallery

🚌 3, 5, 7 Warschauer Straße  
 🚇 1, 3 Schlesisches Tor  
 🚇 1, 3 Warschauer Straße

1.3 kilometres long, the East Side Gallery is the longest remaining section of the Berlin Wall. More than 100 artists have immortalised themselves here with a mural.



### Artpark Tegel

🚌 25 Tegel, then bus 133 to Neheimer Straße  
 🚇 6 Alt-Tegel, then bus 133 to Neheimer Straße  
 🚇 7 to Haselhorst, then bus 133 to Neheimer Straße

Murals up to 42 metres high can be seen from afar on the high-rise buildings of this housing estate near Tegeler See.

\*Please note that street art and art in public spaces are subject to change. Murals that have long been an integral part of the cityscape may disappear. On the other hand, new ones are created. Our graphic is from March 2024.
